INTRODUCTION

1.1 Background of the study

Exploitation is a form of abuse. Moreover, it always involves one person or a group of people reaping benefits at the expense of others. For example, abusing someone refers to the physical or emotional mistreatment of that person, whereas exploitation refers to using someone to reap benefits.

Exploitation means treating someone badly to get some benefit for yourself. In other words, it is a form of abuse where someone is manipulated or forced to doing something that benefits some others. Exploitation can take many forms, occur in various situations, and involve different groups of people.

To exploit someone is to take unfair advantage of them. It is to use another person's vulnerability for one's benefit. Of course, benefitting from another's vulnerability is not always morally wrong—we do not condemn a chess player for exploiting a weakness in his opponent's defense, for instance. But some forms of advantage-taking do seem to be wrong, and it is this normative sense of exploitation that is of primary interest to moral and political philosophers.

Exploitation can be transactional or structural. A shop that pays low wages, for example, or a pharmaceutical research firm that tests drugs on poor subjects in the developing world, might be said to exploit others in this sense. But exploitation can also be structural—a property of institutions or systems in which the "rules of the game" unfairly benefit one group of people to the detriment of another. As we will see below, Karl Marx believed that the economic and political institutions of capitalism were exploitative in this sense.

The short story Pol Pot and The Khmer Rouge is one of the real stories or historical stories that happened in Cambodia in the 1970s. The short story tells of the occurrence of civil war between Cambodia and the Republic of Vietnam that lasts took place over eight years, one month, six days. The communist party was led by Pol Pot and the name Communist Party is Khmer Rouge that finally ruled in the Cambodia capital. Pol Pot led the way with a totalitarian dictatorship, where his government made city residents move to the village to work on collective farms and forced labor projects.

Hell On World deserves the nickname given to the State of Cambodia. The people are always victims, and the horror started when the Khmer Rouge party came to power in Cambodia. The Khmer Rouge made Cambodia a World Hell. Physical exploitation started, all people in Phnom Penh moved to the countryside, where family members were divided from each other, and some people even became victims of the war. The effects of the civil war of harsh working conditions, malnutrition, and lack of medical care cause the death of about 25 percent of the Cambodian population. The history of the Khmer Rouge cannot separate ----from a dictator named Pol Pot. The Khmer Rouge came to power in 1975. For Pol Pot human of life is nothing, Pol Pot has slaughtered his brother like an animal. Pol Pot did the most cruelty of

beating wood to death.

This topic of physical exploitation deserves a thesis because the existence of civil war has greatly affected the life of the people of the capital city. Where the people's life, in Cambodia is very concerned and forced to always comply with all the wishes of the Communist Party. The human value in Cambodia is very threatening because every day usually people die because of exhaustion all day hard-working, and even people are deliberately killed.
