CHAPTER 1

INTRODUCTION

1.1 Background of the Study

Literature is indicated as the absoluteness of how to express emotion through writing, but there is a regulation that not every written work can be classified as literature in the accurate sense of words (Klarer, 2004). Through Literature, everyone can show their thoughts, emotion, imagination, or ideas to share a moral value so that all humankind perhaps can sense the message and take a lesson from it. Moreover, some of the literature work has been created by the reflection on the related situations of someone's life which has occurred. Nowadays, literature is not always described as the written works only. One literary work that has developed by adding sounds and pictures as its supports is film. The film is one particular kind of literary work that implies a lot of moral values. It is the media for entertaining the viewers which appears like a story that contains sounds and images.

This makes film becomes a modern type of literature work due to the development of technology. The film provides various types of themes such as drama, horror, comedy, science, or psychology. The Black Swan film is starred with Natalie Portman as Nina Sayers, who is the main character of the story. Nina live her mother, Erica Sayers who is overprotective and strict. Nina Sayers describes as the dedicated ballerina in New York City ballet company. She is perfect with her technique when she is dancing. Through her appearance and perfect techniques, Nina is portrayed as an innocent girl with an obsession with being perfect. One day, the company announced that there will be a requirement for a new season with Tchaikovsky's Swan Lake. They are looking for a Swan Queen who can play dual roles at once since they have improved the story a little bit. The requirement is occurred due to the forced retirement of the previous ballerina, Beth MacIntyre. Thomas Leroy, the director of the ballet company has chosen the girls that possibly will be the candidates for the audition. Nina is one of the lucky girls who picked by Leroy to enroll for the audition, unfortunately, she failed at the audition because she can not pass to play as Black Swan. This failure is not stopping her from getting the Swan Queen roles, but this obsession leads her to suffer more with mental problems.

The approach that is suitable for this subject of this study is psychoanalysis by Sigmund Freud. The writer is absorbed to analyze the main character of this film Nina Sayers, who is indicated suffered from anxiety after following her obsession with perfection. Anxiety is an uncomfortable feeling in which occurs followed by unexpected painful emotional experience caused by the imbalance

amongst id, ego and superego (Hall, 1954:61). The reason the writer has chosen this approach because the theme of the film itself is also related to the psychological theory. In psychological work commonly discusses about the system personality of human. Talking about anxiety, this topic is aligned with the defense mechanism which has the function to reduce anxiety. Therefore, based on the analysis of the *Black Swan* film, the writer using Psychoanalysis by Sigmund Freud entitled "An Analysis Disorder of Anxiety in Andres Heinz' *Black Swan*".

1.2 Statement of the Problem

Based on the background of the study above, here are the several problems which can be arranged as follows:

- 1. What kind of anxiety that the main character has suffered?
- 2. What are the causes of anxiety disorder suffered by the main character?
- 3. How does the main character cope with her anxiety?

1.3 The objective of the Study

Relating to the statement of the problem, there is the objective of the study as follows:

- 1. To identify what kind of anxiety which the main character has suffered
- To reveal the causes of anxiety disorder suffered by the main character.
- 3. To find out the main character's way to cope with her anxiety

1.4 Significance of the Study

Second, find out the factors that make Nina Sayers is suffering from anxiety. Someone who is struggling with anxiety needs a defense mechanism to reduce their anxiety. For that occasion, the third is the researcher will identify Nina's defense mechanism so that the researcher will find out how Nina Sayers reduces her anxiety.

The method in this research is using the qualitative analysis method. The data is collected by watching the film, choosing the important movie scenes which related to this research, then rewatching the movie all over again to fit the missing gaps. In having collected the data, the researcher has done these kinds of procedure as follow below:

- Watch the movie along with taking a note of the important parts of the movie script
- 2. Analyze the anxiety shows in Nina Sayers
- 3. Analyze how the relationship between Nina Sayer with the supporting characters might lead her to suffer from anxiety. This is possible will be the reason why Nina has anxiety.
- 4. Collect some supporting data from the movie, and implementing the theory to ensure that the findings are valid

1.6 Scope of the Study

The study focuses on finding out the type of anxiety that Nina Sayers has felt according to Sigmund Freud's psychoanalysis theory. The anxiety might appear because the tension between her and other characters. It is crucial to focus on the scene wherein Nina Sayers argues with other characters.
